

MSO Membership Benefits

MSO membership benefits include:

- Voting rights at annual general meetings or AGMs (ordinary and life members only)
- Reduced registration rates for scientific meetings organized or co-organized by the MSO
- Travel grants available for presenters at international meetings (by application)
- Research grants for projects approved by the MSO committee
- Facilitation and support for Special Interest Groups (SIGs). SIGs are aimed at encouraging and promoting to specialists within a given subspecialty to meet and discuss interesting cases and the latest developments in the field in a neutral environment. Currently active SIGs include pediatrics, glaucoma, vitreoretina, oculoplastics and uveitis.
- The ability for members to borrow screening equipment from MSO, which currently includes a Welch Allyn Spot Screener
- The opportunity to be involved in various charitable projects organized by MSO (i.e. the World Sight Day Project and MSO Eye Photo, a free community service project to help primary physicians screen their patients for diabetic retinopathy)
